A hundred years ago in February 1915 the Germans declared the waters around Great Britain and Ireland including the Channel as theatre of war. In the same year the German poet Hermann Loens wrote the Engeland Song and Herms Nils set the music to this poem. Since that time German submariners of both world wars sang this song with the Refrain „For we sail, for we sail, For we sail to take on the English, the English.”

Seventy years ago this phase ended with the Operation Deadlight, the destruction and sinking of German submarines.

I am happy that today the German participants as well as all other submariner friends could sail to England, to our convention in Portsmouth, in peaceful and friendly attitude.


